RE: 3.0T GEMflex Coil Potential Overheating

GE Healthcare has recently become aware of a potential safety issue with the 3.0T GEMflex Coil manufactured by NeoCoil used with GE Healthcare 3.0T Scanners. Please ensure that all potential users in your facility are made aware of this safety notification and the recommended actions.

Safety Issue Part of the cable assembly may overheat when the device is used. Rarely this could result in minor burn injury in case of prolonged direct skin contact with the overheating part. There have been no injuries reported as a result of this issue.

Safety Instructions The issue is observed in various situations of coil setup and port connections. To prevent this issue: Follow the user instructions on using proper padding to avoid all direct contact of the patient with the cable. You may continue to use the device. Ensure that you use the following precautions as described in the 3.0T GEM Flex System Instructions for Use.

- Place the foam cover over the Interface.
- Do not allow the cable to touch the patient. Use a pad to keep the cable from touching the patient.
- Keep the length of the cable in the bore to a minimum.
- The system is indicated for adult use only.
