This patient has received Lormalzi® (donanemab), a monoclonal antibody directed against aggregated forms of beta amyloid, which can cause amyloid-related imaging abnormalities (ARIA). Assess the patient for symptoms of ARIA, including but not limited to those listed on this card. As ARIA can cause focal neurologic deficits that can mimic an ischaemic stroke, please consider if symptoms could be due to ARIA before giving thrombolytic therapy. Please contact the patient's prescribing doctor for further information.

Amyloid-related Imaging Abnormalities (ARIA) with Lormalzi®

- Lormalzi® can cause side effects of brain swelling and bleeding, also known as amyloid-related imaging abnormalities (ARIA), which can be serious, life-threatening or fatal. This is characterised by temporary swelling in areas of the brain, with or without small spots of bleeding in or on the surface of the brain.
- Infrequently, larger areas of bleeding in the brain, known as intracerebral haemorrhage (ICH), can occur.
- Your doctor will arrange brain magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) scans before your second, third, fourth, and seventh doses of Lormalzi®. It is very important that you attend all your scheduled MRI scan appointments to check if you have ARIA. Your doctor may schedule additional scans at other times during treatment if deemed necessary.
- Inform your doctor about any new medications taken during treatment, including medicines supplied by any healthcare professional, especially medicines to reduce blood clots from forming (anti-thrombotic medicines, including acetylsalicylic acid).
- Keep this card with you or your caregiver, and show it to any healthcare professional involved in your treatment so that they know you are taking Lormalzi®.
